As a Voz member, you can look for work at the MLK Jr. Worker Center, have access to free skills trainings, classes, and workshops, and you become part of a community that has your back. Another benefit to being a member at the worker center is there are occasional work opportunities depending on your availability, skillset, and the number of jobs that come in to the center (jobs are sometimes seasonal). The worker center works as a bridge to connect day laborers with fair and just employers that also want to support the Voz mission to protect immigrants and day laborers' rights. The process of connecting day laborers to employers ensures that the two parties agree to the terms of work order agreement after a negotiation process to identify an appropriate wage.
